Travel to Countries with U.S. Sanctions or Travel Warnings

Employees planning foreign travel should be aware of the list of countries that have been sanctioned by the U.S. Government. The Foreign Workers' Compensation policy dictates "**there is no workers' compensation coverage to any country or jurisdiction while any trade sanction, embargo or similar regulation imposed by the US applies to and prohibits the transaction of business with or within that country or jurisdiction.**" A current listing of sanctioned countries can be found on the U.S. Department of Treasury website:

In addition, the U.S. Department of State maintains a list of countries that have travel warnings. The warnings are issued when conditions dictate that a country may be dangerous or unstable. Employees travelling to these countries will have foreign workers' compensation coverage, however, the State Department recommends that "Americans avoid or consider the risk of travel to the country".
